B. First tool: PRAYER



1. Prayer is the primary means for establishing and maintaining a deep and loving personal relationship between ourselves and God.

B. First tool: PRAYER



2. A successful prayer life involves 3 important principles.

3 important principles in a successful prayer life



- a) Our prayer must be faithful.
- Decide to spend time with the Lord everyday
 - Decide on the practical details.
 - Adopt a format to begin.



- b) Our prayer must be led by the Holy Spirit.
- c) Our prayer must be centered on a relationship with Jesus.

B. First tool: PRAYER



3. The intercession of Mary and the saints is a powerful tool of prayer. A devotion to Mary and the saints is part and parcel of a Catholic's faith. Praying the Holy Rosary is such a tool.

4. Make ourselves and our resources available for God's work. Our time, talent, treasure.
5. Evangelize. Share Christ with family, friends, neighbors, co-workers, and the world at large.

1. Fellowship refers to almost everything that Christians do together as a body – as brothers and sisters.


2. We do not become complete Christians by ourselves.

Sacrament of Reconciliation and Eucharist



- a) Though confession is required only once a year, we should avail of this more often. We of course should immediately go to confession if we have committed mortal sin.
- b) Though communion is required only once a year, we should receive communion, with the proper disposition, whenever we go to Mass, which should be at least every Sunday.

F. Fifth tool: SACRAMENTS & Devotion to Mary



3. Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. She is the foremost disciple of Jesus and we can grow by imitating her and asking for her intercession.
